[CHARLOTTE CITY COUNCIL](#)

Charlotte has a council-manager form of government with a mayor and 11 council members elected every two years in November, and a professional city manager to run the day-to-day operations. The mayor and four council members are elected at-large by a city-wide vote. Seven council members are elected from districts by voters who reside in each district. [MECKLENBURG BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS](#)

The nine-member Board of County Commissioners is the governing body of Mecklenburg County. Elections are held in November of even-numbered years with six commissioners elected by district and three commissioners elected at-large. Click link above to see meeting schedule, agenda and minutes.

The nine-member Board of Education is the governing body of Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools, with five primary responsibilities: employ the superintendent, establish policy, determine annual operating and capital budgets, approve student assignment boundaries, and oversee the management of the school district's major systems, including budget and finance, curriculum and instruction, personnel and auxiliary services. The Housing Advisory Board of Charlotte-Mecklenburg (HAB), formerly known as the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Coalition for Housing, is a volunteer appointed board charged with educating, advocating, engaging and partnering with community stakeholders to end and prevent homelessness and ensure a sufficient supply of affordable housing throughout the community.
