Data on veteran homelessness covers the period from July 2018 to January 2019 which coincides with the period during which the work on the veteran homelessness by-name list was aligned with the community work on Built for Zero (BFZ).

² Chronic Veteran Homelessness is a subset of both the Chronic and Veteran by-name lists and includes individuals who meet the definition of chronic and veteran homelessness. This means that this number is not in addition to the other by-name list totals, but already contained with them.
