Quarterly data on individuals and households seeking housing assistance

ONE NUMBER

The **One Number** is a count of the total number of individuals and households within one list who are experiencing homelessness and in need of housing in Charlotte-Mecklenburg. The number is generated from data in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) and includes single adults, youth, veterans, chronic homelessness and individuals in families with children. Whereas the Point-in-Time Count provides a one-night snapshot of the number of people experiencing sheltered and unsheltered homelessness, the One Number provides a more accurate picture of who is experiencing homelessness across the community.


The first One Number will be released as part of the 2019 State of Housing Instability & Homelessness Report. After its initial release, it will be posted monthly here.

MOVEMENT: INFLOW & OUTFLOW

The by-name list totals provide the number of individuals who are actively homeless and the number that have moved into permanent housing. In addition, there is a monthly snapshot of inflow and outflow for each by-name list. Currently, Charlotte-Mecklenburg has a by-name list for individuals experiencing chronic homelessness and veterans experiencing homelessness. Below is a visualization of the inflow and outflow data for the by-name lists.



DEEP DIVE: COORDINATED ENTRY

APRIL - JUNE 2019

This information provides a closer look at Coordinated Entry, which serves as Charlotte-Mecklenburg's portal to reconnect individuals and families who are literally homeless, or those at imminent risk of becoming homeless to an existing available shelter or housing resource. Calling NC 2-1-1, which is a service provided by United Way of Central Carolinas, is the first step to access assistance; but, in cases where there is an immediate crisis, households might bypass the step of dialing 2-1-1 in order to enter emergency shelter. There is not currently a by-name list for all individuals and families accessing Coordinated Entry. The data below is updated quarterly. ASSISTANCE

The total number of calls for housing assistance.

REFERRALS TO AN IN-PERSON COORDINATED ASSESSMENT

The total number of referrals made to an in-person Coordinated Entry assessment from households who called 2-1-1 and were at-risk of or currently experiencing homelessness.

HOUSEHOLDS WHO RECEIVED AN IN-PERSON COORDINATED ASSESSMENT

The total number of households who received an in-person Coordinated Entry assessment.

Not all households who receive a referral show up for an in-person assessment within the same month as the referral and some do not go through with the assessment after their referral is made.
