New Prioritization Process – Erin Nixon

- Meeting with RRH agencies this week – to gain feedback and working to create the matchup process more info to come at next meeting. Next CE meeting or the following meeting will need to carve out time for providers to give feedback.

CE Mapping Project – Erin Nixon and Hannah Marie Warfle

- Currently in the process of mapping how CE works within the homeless system. Using this information to help create MOUs between the county (CE) and the providers. Also helps us understand how the system works, and how it could be improved. Also is helpful for helping those looking from outside the system to better understand how the system works.
- Worked on the goals of the mapping project (see above), the project plan (working to create the map – utilizing a document that was created for the first report done by UNCC for CE) Working to ensure that all agencies are presented on the map – including the PIT count and HIC and HMIS data. Also want to add data to the map (not just naming the agencies). Working to figure out what that that could look like. Also want to create a communication plan of how to best present the tool to the community. Next meeting of the subcommittee is scheduled for July 30th to review the map.

June Data – MaryAnn

- Shared month and quarter data – shows system adjustments for the quarter. Saw a large jump in the number of families that have completed a full assessment. Veterans and Chronic Homeless numbers remained steady.
- Large jump in at risk callers and homeless callers.
- June 23rd 211 began to do the initial intakes again (which includes entering the data into HMIS)
- 97 callers were referred for the motel eviction program (began on June 23rd – June 30th).
- Running about 100 callers more in June 2020 than we saw in June 2019.

- 211 assessment also asks questions that get to if the caller may be eligible for motel eviction funds.
- Process is 211 screening and HMIS entry – then a CE referral.
