Overview of City of Charlotte's ARPA Strategy: - Rebecca Pfeiffer

- City is receiving \$11M in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding to spend for qualifying populations such as:
 - Homeless or at risk of homelessness,
 - Fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence/sex trafficking; and
 - Other populations like families requesting assistance to prevent homelessness, those at greatest risk of housing instability (cost-burdened, N50% AMI)
- HOME-ARP proposal based on large community needs survey conducted in November 2021 with recommendations submitted to City Council in March 2022
- No funding was requested for building shelters or rental housing with intent of targeting more upstream with fairness and transparency, target at-risk which does not require a lease however, residents will have to meet at-risk eligibility guidelines
- Up to four years of rental assistance will be available and give residents more time to connect to permanent housing
- COC staff to draft a proposal for review at 04/19/2022 CEOC meeting rather than voting today

CE Data: - Mary Ann Priester

- Reviewed February and March 2022 data
 - Increase in single adults in March
 - Consistent among households with multiple adults, households with children and veterans
 - 211 issues of referring to CE when should have been prevention and vice versa
 - Still discussing with 211 whether it's confusing to give numbers to both CE and VBH to veterans
- Question for group – Is there other data we need to take a deeper look at? What data points?

Case Conferencing Policy and Process: - Mary Ann Priester

- Committee workgroup began meeting in October 2021 to map out what case conferencing looks like and implement best practices across case conferencing groups

- Proposed policy distributed to members; will review and discuss at the next CEOC meeting with possible vote
