Pathways to Housing PA

- Homeless services organization

- Grown from one team of 70, to eight teams serving over 550 participants
- One-stop shopping for participant needs
- 85% housing retention rate
- High fidelity Housing First

Our Expertise

- The Pathways to Housing model of Housing First
- A one-stop-shop for a wide range of community-based services (Integrated Care clinic, behavioral health therapy, psychiatry, nursing, case management, MOUD, peer services, etc.)
- The first to devote an ACT team to people with primary OUD diagnosis in a scattered-site Housing First program
- We heavily focus on harm reduction and community inclusion



Philadelphia Furniture Bank

- Opened in 2014
- Provides furniture to organizations in Philadelphia working with individuals exiting homelessness
- Member agency model
- Helped 13,607 individuals and furnished over 5,960 homes since opening
- Donations from individuals, businesses, hotels, etc.
- Keeps perfectly good stuff out of landfills

Housing First University

- Launched Fall 2019
- Outward-facing training and educational initiative
- Housing First, harm reduction, integrated care, and service delivery best practices
- 500+ trainings, 40+ conference presentations
- >6,000 unique individuals
- 42 states and 13 countries

Good Haul

- Launched in Summer 2022
- A social enterprise junk hauling business
- Ranging from commercial clean out to small furniture pick-up
- Majority of items picked up will be repurposed
- Works closely PFB with revenue reinvested back into PFB
- A Work First site

- Launched in 2021
- Non-profit development
- Turn abandoned lots and homes into affordable housing
- Neighborhood needs assessments to provide added value to our new neighbors
- Once the first project of 15-25 units is complete, start the next project, rebuilding communities brick by brick






A note on the training process

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

Training Registration


- <u>Register via Zoom</u>
