#### CHARLOTTE-MECKLENBURG CONTINUUM OF CARE

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Continuum of Care Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Request for Letters of Interest Information Document

June 10, 2025

The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Continuum of Care (CoC) is charged by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NC DHHS) to submit a community-wide application for Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds. The CoC anticipates that NC DHHS will allow the Charlotte-Mecklenburg CoC to apply for approximately \$499,045 in this competition, which is slightly more than the CoC's allocation last year.

This announcement serves as the opportunity for agencies to submit a Letter of Interest (LOI) to express their interest in submitting a project application through this ESG funding competition.

The CoC Governing Board has approved the following priorities for this funding and gives discretion to the Ranking Committee to recommend strong proposals that may change the final breakdown:

65% (\$324,379.25) toward Housing Stability (Homelessness Prevention, Rapid Re-Housing)

35% (\$174,665.75) toward Crisis Response (Street Outreach, Emergency Shelter)

## **INTRODUCTION:**

Eligible ESG Activities:

- Street Outreach: Essential services related to reaching out to unsheltered homeless individuals
  and families, connecting them with emergency shelter, housing, or critical services, and
  providing them with urgent, non-facility-based care. Eligible costs include engagement, case
  management, emergency health and mental health services, transportation, and services for
  special populations.
- Emergency Shelter:
  - Services, including case management, childcare, education services, employment
    assistance and job training, outpatient health services, legal services, life skills training,
    mental health services, substance abuse treatment services, transportation, and
    services for special populations.
  - Operations, including maintenance, rent, repair, security, fuel, equipment, insurance, utilities, food, furnishings, and supplies necessary for the operation of the emergency shelter. Where no appropriate emergency shelter is available for a homeless family or individual, eligible costs may also include a hotel or motel voucher for that family or individual. Renovation of shelters is also an eligible activity.
- Rapid Re-Housing Assistance: Housing relocation and stabilization services and/or short-and/or medium-term rental assistance as necessary to help individuals or families living in shelters or in

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places not meant for human habitation move as quickly as possible into permanent housing and achieve stability in that housing.

- Homelessness Prevention: Housing relocation and stabilization services and short-and/or
  medium-term rental assistance as necessary to prevent the individual or family from moving to
  an emergency shelter, a place not meant for human habitation, or another literally homeless
  situation.
- Homeless Management Information System (or comparable database if Domestic Violence Provider). \*eligible activity only if in conjunction with another eligible activity: ESG funds may be used to pay for the costs of participating in and contributing to the HMIS designated by the Continuum of Care for the area.

Note: Contracts will be effective January 1, 2026 – December 31, 2026

Submission of a Letter of Interest does not constitute an application, nor does it constitute approval for funding by the Charlotte-Mecklenburg CoC or by NC DHHS.

## WHO CAN SUBMIT A LETTER OF INTEREST:

## Agencies that:

- Are a local government and/or private nonprofit organization with current 501(c)(3) status, that operates in Mecklenburg County
- Have experience providing outreach, shelter and/or housing services to individuals or families experiencing homelessness
- Utilize a Housing First approach: Housing First is a model of housing assistance that prioritizes
  rapid placement and stabilization in permanent housing that does not have service participation
  requirements or preconditions (such as sobriety or a minimum income threshold).
- Are prepared to utilize or already utilize the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) to record client level data (or comparable database if Domestic Violence Provider).
- Have the infrastructure and capacity to process payments and reimbursements in accordance with NC DHHS guidelines

#### **PROCESS:**

- 1. All interested agencies must complete the LOI via Microsoft Forms.
- LOIs will be reviewed and evaluated according to the criteria stated in this announcement.
   Agencies will be notified if they are or are not recommended to submit a full application for funding consideration.
- 3. Agencies recommended to submit a full application will receive an invitation via email to submit a full project application including instructions.
  - Agencies that are not recommended will be provided a written explanation of the reason(s) the project was not recommended.

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## **LOI SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS:**

All LOIs must be submitted electronically no later than 5:00pm on Monday, June 23, 2025, via Microsoft Forms. LOIs submitted after the deadline will not be reviewed or considered.
